

CALL FOR INCLUSION ON THE LIST OF REGISTERED SUPPLIERS FREELANCE LAWYER-LINGUISTS FOR DUTCH

Title:	Freelance lawyer-linguists for Dutch

Section:	Legal Revision and National Law Sections
Function:	The Lawyer-Linguists Division is responsible for implementing the ECB's linguistic regime as regards the preparation and adoption of ECB legal acts and instruments in the 23 official Community languages, for reviewing such texts for legal, linguistic and terminological consistency and for maintaining a legal terminology database.
	The Division also coordinates the preparation of the ECB's opinion when the ECB is consulted on draft national legislative provisions. Furthermore, staff lawyer- linguists provide national legal expertise to the ECB and monitor relevant legal developments in their Member State.
	The Division is currently seeking to expand its list of freelance lawyer-linguists and would welcome applications from qualified candidates who have a perfect command of Dutch.
	Selected applicants will be added to the list and invited to tender when work opportunities arise. Freelance translation assignments are normally carried out from home but may sometimes need to be performed on the ECB's premises.
	It is the intention of the ECB to use its list of registered suppliers with a view to the awarding of framework contracts in the future without publication of a notice.
Qualifications and experience:	Applicants must fulfil the following qualifications and experience:
	Perfect command of Dutch and excellent English.
	 University degree in law awarded in a Member State where Dutch is an official language.
	• At least two years proven relevant professional translation experience,
	 A sound background knowledge of Community law and financial and economic affairs,
	 Advanced PC skills and a practical knowledge of standard MS Office applications are essential.
Further general qualifications:	It would be an advantage for applicants to have the following qualifications and experience:
	 Proven professional translation experience in the legal, financial or economic field;

	• National legal expertise and professional experience in the legal field in the relevant EU Member State;
	• Familiarity with the ECB, other EU institutions, international organisations, De Nederlandsche Bank and the financial sector would be an advantage.
	• Familiarity with the terminology management package TRADOS MultiTerm, and translation memory software, TRADOS Translator's Workbench, would be an advantage.
How to apply:	Applications must be submitted in Dutch and in English and must include a covering letter and standardised curriculum vitae (see http://europass.cedefop.europa.eu/europass/home/vernav/Europasss+D ocuments/Europass+CV/navigate.action), together with all the supporting documentation (copies of qualification certificates, proof of professional translation experience in-house or freelance, letters of reference, etc.) necessary to provide the required qualifications and experience (Incomplete applications, i.e. with no supporting documentation will not be considered). Pre-selection procedure:	In order to further develop its list of registered suppliers, the ECB will evaluate the applications against the qualifying criteria specified above and will send a written test to those applicants who fulfil these criteria. The names of the successful candidates (i.e. those who pass the written test) will be put on the list of registered suppliers. Inclusion on this list is no guarantee of suppliers receiving regular work from the ECB, with most regular needs being met by framework contractors.
Closing date:	The ECB may, at its discretion, exclude applications that do not meet the qualifying criteria, do not contain the information requested or are otherwise incomplete. 31 January 2009
